Microgrants Application Deadline: Applications will be accepted on an ongoing basis in 2022

GRANT APPLICATION GUIDELINES

General

In December 2020 the YVR Art Foundation (YVRAF) Masterpiece Study Program was renamed the Bill McLennan Masterpiece Study Program (BMMSP) in memory of longtime YVRAF board member Bill McLennan.

Microgrants are \$500 grants for BC and Yukon First Nations artists and researchers who wish to further their art or community practice through the research/study of BC and Yukon Indigenous art and artifacts either in person or virtually with a YVRAF museum partner. If applicants propose a collections visit at a museum other than a YVRAF museum partner, they should describe why the collection is important to the research work they will be conducting.

Microgrants are intended to cover minor costs associated with short (one day) or virtual collections visits, including for example time, meals and/or materials associated with the visits. If you are already visiting a city where a museum partner or a relevant collection is located, you are eligible to apply for a Microgrant to assist with in-person research costs. Who May Apply

To be eligible for a YVR Art Foundation Bill McLennan Masterpiece Study Program Microgrant applicants must:

- Be a practicing artist of BC or Yukon First Nations ancestry.
- Reside in BC or the Yukon.
- Applicants must propose to research/study BC and Yukon Indigenous art and artifacts held in the collection of a YVRAF museum partner or another museum with a relevant collection.
- Complete and submit a short application outlining an independent, self-directed study opportunity at/with a proposed museum partner.

- Receiving a Bill McLennan Masterpiece Study Program Microgrant does not preclude an applicant's eligibility to receive the maximum of two BMMSP Travel Grants when the travel grant program is re-started.

If your application is approved for a Microgrant, recipients will:

- Provide YVRAF with a confirmation letter from the museum confirming an in-person or virtual collections visit.
- Sign a one page Letter of Agreement.
- Complete a brief questionnaire following their collections visit.

Eligibility Notes

- If you have questions about your First Nations eligibility, please contact the Program Coordinator at programs@yvraf.com or by phone at 604.276.6261. BC First Nations eligibility includes BC Metis Citizenship.
- You must submit your Microgrant application before your collections visit date. Applications received after your scheduled collections visit date will not be reviewed.

Grant Amount

Up to ten microgrants of \$500 will be awarded in 2022.

Selection Process and Notification of Results

Applicants should apply as soon as they know the approximate date for their museum collections visit. Applications for BMMSP Microgrants can be submitted anytime throughout the year. Applicants will be notified of results as soon as possible and a maximum of one month after submission of their application. Applications to the BMMSP Microgrant stream will be reviewed by a YVRAF Selections Committee on a monthly basis.

- Please put your name on each photo and the number that corresponds to the portfolio description sheet (see below).
- A completed copy of the portfolio description sheet must accompany the images you submit.
- Make sure the names and numbers of the photos of your work match the names and numbers of those listed on the portfolio description sheet.
- Photos or photocopies of work must be **no larger than 8 1/2 x 11 inches**; if the photos or photocopies are smaller than 8 1/2 x 11 inches, please attach them to an 8 1/2 x 11 inch sheet of paper, in order to keep the application format consistent.
- Do not staple or bind pages together

Film/video portfolio submissions:

- If you wish to include an example of your film or video work in your portfolio you may submit this through Dropbox or a similar file sharing medium. Please notify us that you will be submitting film/video and by which method by contacting the Program Coordinator at programs@yvraf.com in advance of your submission.
- If you are submitting your film or video work for your entire portfolio you may submit no more than two videos at a maximum of five minutes each.
- If you are submitting your film or video work as part of your portfolio, each video submitted is the equivalent of submitting two photographs. For example, if you submit two videos you may only include one additional photograph in your portfolio submission.
